D. INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

2. Res. 106-07 - Endorsement of Elderly Housing Project - Hopkins Village Preservation Limited

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution approving the development of housing in Essex, Baltimore County, Maryland, to be financed either directly by the Department of Housing and Community Development of the State of Maryland or through the Department's Community Development administration. Mary Harvey appeared. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Oliver, seconded by Councilman Olszewski, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

3. Res. 107-07 - PILOT - Hopkins Village Preservation Limited Partnership

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution to authorize the County Executive or other authorized administrative official to enter into written agreement on behalf of the County with Hopkins Village Preservation Limited Partnership for the payment of stipulated amounts in lieu of regular real property taxes in order to facilitate the development of an elderly housing project to benefit low income elderly persons, 62 years of age or older in Baltimore County. Mary Harvey remained. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Bartenfelder, seconded by Councilman Olszewski, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

4. Res. 108-07 - Endorsement of Financial Assistance for Shelter Eldercare Foundation - Elderly Housing

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution approving the development of housing in Catonsville, Baltimore County, Maryland, a loan to Shelter Eldercare Foundation to assist in financing the renovation of Park View Apartments at Catonsville. Mary Harvey remained. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Oliver, seconded by Councilman Moxley, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

5. Res. 109-07 -To Accept Information Booklets for Seniors from Patuxent Publishing Company

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution to authorize the County to accept a gift for the use of Baltimore County, Maryland. Arnold Eppel appeared. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Oliver, seconded by Councilman Bartenfelder, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

6. Res. 110-07 - Amendments to the Water Supply and Sewage Plan

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution to amend the Baltimore County Water Supply and Sewage Plan. Bill Korpman appeared. There being no

discussion, upon motion by Councilman Bartenfelder, seconded by Councilman Olszewski, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

7. Res. 111-07 - Property Tax Exemption - Winnie T. Nissley

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Winnie T. Nissley who is entitled to an exemption from State and County real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to surviving spouses of disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman McIntire, seconded by Councilman Bartenfelder, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

8. Res. 112-07 - Creation of the Lansdowne Commercial Revitalization Action Area District

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution for the purpose creating the Lansdowne Commercial Revitalization Action Area District. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Moxley, seconded by Councilman Olszewski, this Resolution was unanimously approved.
