# 1. Agreement - The Good Samaritan Hospital of MD, Inc. - Clinical Education - Fire Dept.

An agreement for clinical services with The Good Samaritan Hospital of Maryland, Inc., to provide clinical education for advanced life support students from the Fire Department paramedic program.

### 2. Contract - Xerox Corporation - Copier Rental - OIT

A contract with Xerox Corporation, to rent a Xerox model #P120-MFFC photocopier. The rental term is for 60 month, maintenance is included.

# 3. <u>Contract - East Coast Specialized Hauling, LLC - Snow Removal and Deicing Services</u>

A contract with East Coast Specialized Hauling, LLC, to provide snow removal and deicing services at the Public Safety Building and Drumcastle Center.

### 4. Contracts - (11) - Snow Removal and Deicing services

Eleven contracts for snow removal and deicing services. These contracts are to handle the removal of snow and ice from all roads with traffic volumes of 10,000 vehicles per day or greater, which will allow the Department of Public Works' trucks to move into the subdivision streets more quickly.

### 5. Contract - Language Line Services, Inc. - Foreign language telephone interpreter

A contract of sale with Language Line Services, Inc., to provide foreign language telephone interpreter services, for Baltimore County agencies.
