1. Addendum to Contract - Wallace Montgomery & Associates, LLP - Traffic Engineering

An addendum to the contract with Wallace Montgomery & Associates, LLP, to increase the maximum amount payable by the County to the Engineer to provide additional on-call engineering services.

2. Contracts- (2) - Disposal of Residential and Commercial Municipal Solid Waste

Two contracts with Wheelabrator Baltimore, L.P. and Republic Services of Pennsylvania, LLC, to provide the disposal of residential and commercial municipal solid waste, deposited at the Baltimore County transfer stations by the County's curbside trash haulers.

3. This item was withdrawn prior to the meeting.

4. <u>Contracts of Sale - (2) Thomas - Willow Green Lane - Water and Sewer Line</u> Installation

Two contracts of sale with Robert Thomas, Jr., William C. Thomas and Brenda J. Thomas, to acquire drainage and utility easements and temporary construction areas, located at Willow Green Lane, for the installation of water and sewer lines to serve properties on Willow Green Lane in accordance with a health project.

5. <u>Contract - PAH, Inc. - t/a Paradise Animal Hospital - Veterinarian Services for Police K-9 Unit</u>

A contract with PAH, Inc. t/a Paradise Animal Hospital, to provide professional veterinarian services for the dogs assigned to the Baltimore County Police Departments' K-9 Unit.

There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Moxley, seconded by Councilman Oliver, Fiscal Matters 1, 2, 4 and 5 were unanimously approved.

G. MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

1. Correspondence

____At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read the correspondence from the Office of Budget and Finance listing the non-competitive awards made during October and November, 2009.

2. Res. 86-09 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Jimmy Johnson

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Jimmy Johnson who is entitled to an exemption from State and County real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Oliver, seconded by Councilman Moxley, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

3. Res. 87-09 - Adoption of Overlea-Fullerton Community Plan as part of Master Plan 2010

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this resolution of the Baltimore County Council to adopt the Overlea-Fullerton Community Plan as part of the Baltimore County Master Plan 2010. Councilman Bartenfelder commented. There being no further discussion, upon motion by Councilman Bartenfelder, seconded by Councilman Kamenetz, this Resolution was unanimously approved.
