While it does not include enforcement of ID inspections, we have conducted 2 ID inspections with the assistance of Baltimore County Police Cadets. These two enforcement inspections occurred in the Reisterstown and Perry Hall areas. Reisterstown elicited a very poor pass rate while Perry Hall was much better than expected.  The other portions of the FY 13 Enforcement element include retailer education on youth access and product placement laws as well as inspections for proper product placement.
