FOR the purpose of making a correction to Bill 52-07 by amending the Baltimore County Charter to remove the prohibition on serving as a member of the County Council while holding employment with the State; and generally relating to the qualifications of members of the County Council.

Section 202(b) Article II. The County Council Baltimore County Charter, as proposed for amendment by Bill 52-07

- (b) Other offices. No person shall qualify or serve as a member of the county council while
 he holds any other office of profit of or under the state or ANY OFFICE OF PROFIT OR

 EMPLOYMENT OF OR UNDER THE county, and no member of the county council, during his
 term of office, shall be eligible for appointment to any county office, position or employment
 carrying compensation except the office of county executive.
 - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that pursuant to Section 1202 of the Baltimore County Charter, the question whether or not the Charter is to be amended as proposed by this Act shall be submitted to the voters of Baltimore County at the general election on November 4, 2008, and that this Act shall be published in at least two newspapers of general circulation in the County for five successive weeks prior to the election.
 - Section 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that upon ratification by the voters of Baltimore County, this Act shall become effective for the term of office beginning December 6, 2010.
