AN ACT concerning

O.T. Zone

FOR the purpose of amending the list of principal uses permitted as a matter of right in the Office and Technology zone; and generally relating to permitted uses in the O.T. Zone.

FOR the purpose of prohibiting residential uses as a matter of right in the O.T. Zone in certain areas of the County; and generally relating to permitted uses in the O.T. Zone.

By repealing and reenacting, with amendments

Section 209.3.A. Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, as amended

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
COUNTY, MARYLAND, that Section 209.3.A. of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, as
amended, be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:
