- 1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
- 2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that Section 17-2-104, of Title 2. Firearms and weapons, of Article 17.
- 3 Miscellaneous provisions and offenses, of the Baltimore County Code, 2003 as amended, is hereby
- 4 repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

§ 17-2-104.

1	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
2	(2) (i) ["Stun gun"] "ELECTRONIC CONTROL DEVICE" means [any] A
3	portable[, electronic shock transmitting] device [that is] designed [and intended to incapacitate an
4	individual's neuromuscular system] AS A WEAPON CAPABLE OF INJURING, IMMOBILIZING,
5	OR INFLICTING PAIN ON AN INDIVIDUAL by the discharge of [nonprojectible electric]
6	ELECTRICAL current.
7	(ii) ["Stun gun"] "ELECTRONIC CONTROL DEVICE" does not include
8	bona fide medical equipment.
9	(3) "Law enforcement personnel" means a full-time member of a police force or
10	other agency of the United States, a state, county, municipal corporation, or other political
11	subdivision who is responsible for the prevention and detection of crime and the enforcement of
12	laws.
13	(b) [(1) Except for] THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO law enforcement
14	personnel ACTING [while] WITHIN THE SCOPE OF OR in the performance of official [duties,
15	a] DUTIES.
16	(C)(1) A person may not use, possess, or discharge [a stun gun] AN ELECTRONIC
17	CONTROL DEVICE.
18	(2) A person may not sell, offer to sell, rent, offer to rent, transfer, or offer to
19	transfer [a stun gun] AN ELECTRONIC CONTROL DEVICE to a person [unless the person is law
20	enforcement personnel].
21	[(c)] (D) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on
22	conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisonment not exceeding 6 months or
23	both.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having passed by the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect on September 21, 2009.
