A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

The 2009-2010 Current Expense Budget Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety (DDACTS) Grant

FOR the purpose of amending the 2009-2010 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund monies derived from federal funds and made available to the County through the United States Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has made an award of federal funds available to the Baltimore County Police Department, to be used for salary, fringe benefits, computer and related software for one new part-time Crime Analyst in order to expand the Data Drive Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety (DDACTS) program whose purpose is to promote timely and accurate data collection and analysis for the extension of strategic operations and resources by law enforcement for maximum impact in the community; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 306 and 712(a) of the Baltimore County Charter and Section 10-6-102 of the Baltimore County Code, 2003, as amended, the County Council may accept gifts and grants, appropriate same to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund and expend the same, said fund having been established solely for the purpose of accounting for certain monetary gifts and grants made available to the County for restricted purposes; and

WHEREAS, such fund remains open perpetually as a mechanism to account for the respective gift and grant appropriations and expenditures throughout the entire term of the grant period, including beyond the current expense budget fiscal year; now therefore

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

COUNTY, MARYLAND, pursuant to the power and authority conferred upon it by Sections 306

and 712(a) of the Baltimore County Charter and Section 10-6-102 of the Baltimore County Code,

2003, as amended, that the Current Expense Budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, be and

is hereby amended by appropriating federal funds made available to the Baltimore County Police

Department, in the amount herein specified, to the following program:
