A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Employees Retirement System - Pay Schedule VII Employees

FOR the purpose of decreasing the amount of sick leave a Pay Schedule VII employee may accrue; increasing contributions to the retirement system by Pay Schedule VII members of the retirement system; decreasing the number of unused sick leave days a Pay Schedule VII member of the retirement system may count toward one month of membership service; providing for retroactive effect for portions of this Act; providing for increased contributions over a limited period of time to account for a certain contribution deficit; and generally relating to sick leave accrued and used by, and the rate of contributions paid by, certain employees.

(b) (2) Upon verification to the Board of Trustees, an employee of the Fire
Department who is a member AND, BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2015, AN EMPLOYEE OF
THE POLICE DEPARTMENT ON PAY SCHEDULE VII WHO IS A MEMBER, at the time of
retirement shall receive membership service for unused sick leave in accordance with the formula
that sixteen (16) days of unused sick leave are equal to one (1) month of membership service.
One (1) additional month of membership service shall be granted if fractional days totaling eight
(8) or more result from the application of this formula.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that Section 1 of this Act shall take effect as provided in Section 6 of this Act retroactive to January 1, 2013.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that Section 2 of this Act shall take effect as provided in Section 6 of this Act retroactive to July 1, 2012. Notwithstanding the rates of contribution provided for in § 5-1-203(11) of the Baltimore County Code, 2003, Pay Schedule VII employees shall make up for the deficit in contributions from July 1, 2012 to the effective date of this Act through increased contributions over a period of not less than 2 years from the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having passed by the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect on June 5, 2013.
