FOR the purpose of adding certain geographic areas to the general requirement that bicycle parking be provided for certain non-residential projects; and generally relating to bicycle parking.

BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments

Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, as amended by Bill 38-13

1	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2	COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations read as follows:
3	§ 409.13. Bicycle Parking.
4	A. General requirements. Bicycle parking shall be provided and installed as part of all new
5	construction projects (excluding single-family detached residential) and remodeling projects
6	of over 50% expansion in the C.T. District of Towson, THE LOCH RAVEN
7	COMMERCIAL REVITALIZATION DISTRICT, THE PERRY HALL COMMERCIAL
8	REVITALIZATION DISTRICT, [and] the Catonsville Commercial Revitalization District
9	THE ARBUTUS COMMERCIAL REVITALIZATION DISTRICT, THE LANSDOWNE
10	COMMERCIAL REVITALIZATION DISTRICT, THE BALTIMORE NATIONAL PIKE
11	COMMERCIAL REVITALIZATION DISTRICT, AND AS PART OF NEW
12	COMMERCIAL STRUCTURES IN THE HONEYGO AREA as follows:
13	1. The minimum amount of bicycle parking required shall be determined by multiplying
14	the total number of off-street parking spaces required for the applicable use set forth
15	in Section 409.6 by .04 (4%).
16	2. If the calculation is determined to be a number less than .5 space, then providing and
17	installing bicycle parking is optional.
18	3. In all other cases, the amount of bicycle parking required shall be the next highest
19	whole number.

21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act shall take effect forty-five
22	(45) days after its enactment.
