A BILL
ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Hucksters and Peddlers

FOR the purpose of altering the time frames during which the selling of goods or services is permitted by licensed persons to the occupants of certain residential properties; and generally relating to door-to-door soliciting.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments

Section 21-11-106(c)
Article 21 - Permits, Licenses, and Business Regulation
Title 11 - Hucksters and Peddlers
Baltimore County Code 2003

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Laws of Baltimore County, Maryland read as follows:

1 § 21-11-106. Prohibited Acts.

2 (c) “No soliciting” signs; sunset.

3 (1) A person subject to this title may not offer any service or item of merchandise for sale to
4 the occupant of a residential property in the county if the owner or occupant has visibly displayed
5 on the property a “no soliciting” sign, or a sign containing similar words.

6 (2) The prohibition of paragraph (1) applies to all residences in a neighborhood or community
7 if the neighborhood or community has displayed a “no soliciting” sign, or a sign containing similar
8 words, at each vehicle entrance to the neighborhood or community.

9 (3) A person subject to this title may not offer any service or item of merchandise for sale to
10 the occupant of a residential property in the county before 9:00 a.m. or after [5:00 p.m., or] sunset
11 on any day[, whichever is earlier]. “Sunset” means the time of day identified by the National
12 Weather Service as the time for sunset on that day in the Baltimore metropolitan area.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act shall take effect forty-five
14 (45) days after its enactment.
