# A BILL ENTITLED

#### AN ACT concerning

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Comprehensive Zoning Map Process

FOR the purpose of permitting a Council member to withdraw, under certain circumstances, a

Comprehensive Zoning Map issue that the member filed; correcting certain language; and
generally relating to the Comprehensive Zoning Map process.

BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments Sections 32-3-214(a) Article 32 - Planning, Zoning, and Subdivision Control Title 3 - Zoning Baltimore County Code 2003

#### SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Laws of Baltimore County read as follows:

AUTHORITY TO RAISE ISSUES; SCHEDULES AND FEES. 2 (a) Schedule. 3 (1) The time period for filing issues during the comprehensive zoning map process: 4 (i) Begins on September 1 every fourth year starting in 2003; and 5 (ii) Ends on November 30 of the same year. 6 (2) During the time period established under paragraph (1) of this subsection, issues may be 7 filed as follows: 8 Beginning Ending 9 Period 1. Public and Planning Director September 1 October 15 10 Period 2. Planning Board and Planning Director October 1 October 31 11 Period 3. County Council November 1 November 30 12 13 (3) A person may not [raise] FILE a new issue after November 30. 14 (4) (1) -{An} EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, 15 AN issue may not be withdrawn or modified after it is accepted for filing. 16 (II) AT ANY TIME PRIOR TO APRIL 22, A MEMBER OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL 17 MAY WITHDRAW AN ISSUE THAT THE MEMBER FILED, OR A PART OF AN ISSUE, IF 18 THE ISSUE, OR PART, INCLUDES COUNTY OR OTHER GOVERNMENT PROPERTY.
  - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that, not later than 5:00 p.m. on the third full weekday after enactment of this Act, and notwithstanding any other provision of law, a

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- 1 member of the County Council may withdraw an issue that the member filed, or part of an issue,
- if the issue, or part, includes county or other government property.
- 3 SECTION 2 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by
- 4 the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect on April 17, 2016
- 5 <u>upon enactment</u>.
