- FOR the purpose of amending the County Charter to rename the Department of Public Worksto be the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure, altering the qualifications of
 the Director of the Department, and modifying modify the functions of the Department.
- BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments

Sections 307(b), 402(c), 504(1), 525, 526, and 527 Baltimore County Charter

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

- 2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that under the authority granted by Article XII Manner of
- 3 Terminating This Charter and Making Amendments Thereto, Section 1202 of the Baltimore
- 4 County Charter, that Sections 307(b), 402(c), 504(1), 525, 526, and 527 of the Baltimore County
- 5 Charter are hereby repealed and re-enacted, and proposed to read as follows:

- 7 Article III. The Legislative Branch.
- 8 § 307. The Metropolitan District.
- 9 (b) Division of executive and legislative functions. The affairs of the Metropolitan District shall 10 continue, as heretofore, to be administered as a division of the department of spublic works 11 TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE, as more particularly provided in Article V of 12 this Charter. The county executive, or the chief engineer of the Metropolitan District acting 13 under his authority and under the supervision of the county administrative officer, shall have in 14 respect of the Metropolitan District all duties and powers relating to the appointment and 15 discharge of staff, professional and clerical employees, subject, however, to the merit system 16 provisions of Article VIII hereof, the preparation of all accounts and reports, the giving of 17 notices, the fixing of special assessments and connection charges, and all other executive functions relating to the day-to-day administration of the affairs of the district as may be 18 19 provided in the Act aforesaid. The county council shall have in respect of the Metropolitan 20 District all duties and powers relating to the approval of extensions to the boundaries of the 21 Metropolitan District, the issuance of bonds or other evidences of indebtedness by the district, 22 and all other legislative functions which prior to the adoption of this Charter were vested in the 23 county commissioners under the Act aforesaid.

1	Article IV. The Executive Branch.
2	§ 402. County Executive.
3	(c) Temporary absence of county executive. During the temporary disability or absence from
4	the county of the county executive, the county administrative officer shall serve as acting county
5	executive. If both the county executive and the county administrative officer are temporarily
6	disabled or absent from the county, the director of the budget, as the acting county administrative
7	officer, shall also serve as acting county executive, unless the county council designates the head
8	of another office in the administrative services, or the director of {public works}
9	TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE to serve as acting county executive. If a
10	county executive fails actively to perform the daily duties and responsibilities of his office for a
11	continuous period of six months, his office may be declared vacant by the affirmative vote of a
12	majority of the total number of county council members established by this Charter, and such
13	vacancy shall thereupon be filled in the manner above provided in Section 402(b) of this Article.
14	An acting county executive shall have the same rights, duties, powers and obligations as an
15	elected incumbent of said office, exclusive, however, of the power of executive veto.

19	§ 504. Departments.
20	There shall be the following departments in the administrative services:
21	(1) Department of [public works] TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE.

5	§ 525. Director of [public works] TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE.
6	The department of {public works} TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE
7	shall be administered by the director of [public works] TRANSPORTATION AND
8	INFRASTRUCTURE who shall be a professional engineer registered under the laws of this
9	state, and shall have had responsible charge of engineering works over a period of at least ten
10	years, INCLUDING THE PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION OF PEDESTRIAN AND
11	BICYCLE MOBILITY AND TRAFFIC CALMING, prior to his appointment. He shall have
12	such other qualifications as may be provided by law. He shall be appointed solely with regard to
13	his qualifications for the duties of his office and shall be responsible directly to the county
14	administrative officer.

16	§ 526. Functions of department of [public works] TRANSPORTATION AND
17	INFRASTRUCTURE.
18	The department of [public works] TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE
19	shall have and perform such functions and duties as may be provided from time to time in the
20	public local laws of Baltimore County, with the exception, however, of all functions of the
21	zoning commissioner and those relating to building permits and building and zoning laws and
22	regulations. The department shall have such other functions as may be provided by directive of
23	the county administrative officer or by legislative act of the county council not inconsistent with

this Charter or the provisions of applicable law.

In addition thereto, the department of {public works} TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE shall be responsible for MOBILITY, traffic safety, and engineering USING A VARIETY OF TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS INCLUDING HIGHWAYS, BIKE LANES, PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS, AND TRANSIT WHERE APPROPRIATE, and is hereby granted full power and authority and directed to promulgate and adopt such rules and regulations relating to the standing or parking of motor vehicles and movement of vehicular and expeditious movement of traffic throughout Baltimore County: provided, however, that no rule or regulation promulgated by the director under such power and authority shall be deemed valid or effective until the expiration of forty-five days written notice of the promulgation of the same to the county council. The county council shall at all times have the power to repeal, amend, or modify any rules and regulations promulgated in accordance with this provision and to enact, amend, or repeal laws relating to such matters on its own initiative.

§ 527. The Metropolitan District.

As provided in Article III, Section 307 of this Charter, the Metropolitan District shall continue as heretofore to be administered as a division of the department of {public works} TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE. Nothing in this Charter contained, however, shall be held or construed as preventing the county administrative officer, by directive, or the county council, by legislative act, from recognizing the Metropolitan District as a separate department or from transferring its duties and functions, in whole or in part, to other offices and departments in the administrative services of the county to the extent permitted by law.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that pursuant to Section 1202 of the
Baltimore County Charter, the question whether or not the Charter is to be amended as proposed
by this Act shall be submitted to the voters of Baltimore County at the general election on
November 6, 2018, and that this Act shall be published in at least two newspapers of general
circulation in the County for five successive weeks prior to the election.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that upon ratification by the voters of Baltimore County, this Act shall become effective from and after the thirtieth day following said election.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that except as expressly provided to the contrary in this Act, any transaction or property interest affected by or flowing from any change of nomenclature or any provision of the Charter or statute amended, repealed, or transferred by this Act and validly entered into or existing before the effective date of this Act and every right, duty, or interest flowing from the statute, remains valid after the effective date of this Act and may be terminated, completed, consummated, or enforced as required or allowed by any provision of the Charter or statute amended, repealed, or transferred by this Act as though the repeal, amendment, or transfer had not occurred. If the change in nomenclature involves a change in name or designation of any County unit, the successor unit shall be considered in all respects as having the powers and obligations granted the former unit.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that except as expressly provided in this Act, the continuity of every commission, office, department, agency, bureau, or other unit in existence on the effective date of this Act is retained. The personnel, records, files, furniture, fixtures, and other properties and all appropriations, credits, assets, liabilities, and obligations of each retained unit are continued as the personnel, records, files, furniture, fixtures, properties, appropriations, credits, assets, liabilities, and obligations of the unit under the laws enacted by this Act.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that except as expressly provided to the contrary in this Act, any person licensed, registered, certified, or issued a permit or certificate by any commission, office, department, agency, bureau, or other unit established or continued by any provision of the Charter or statute amended, repealed, or transferred by this Act is considered for all purposes to be licensed, registered, certified, or issued a permit or certificate by the appropriate unit continued under this Act for the duration of the term for which the

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that notwithstanding any references in any other Codes, Regulations, Policies, Laws, Ordinances, or the County Code, the name of the Department that will replace the Department of Public Works shall be the "Department of Transportation and Infrastructure" and the publishers of the Baltimore County Code, 2015 and the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations shall hereafter publish every new reference to the Department or Director of Public Works as the Department or Director of Transportation and Infrastructure.
