AN ACT concerning

Baltimore County Behavioral Health Advisory Council

FOR the purpose of establishing the Baltimore County Behavioral Health Advisory Council; providing for the duties and membership of the Council; providing for the terms of the members; requiring the Behavioral Health Advisory Council to appoint the chair and vice chair of the Behavioral Health Advisory Council; authorizing the Behavioral Health Advisory Council to adopt certain procedures; requiring the Behavioral Health Advisory Council to meet at least a certain number of times a year; providing that a member may not receive compensation as a member of the Behavioral Health Advisory Council but is entitled to certain reimbursement for expenses; requiring the Health Officer or Bureau of Behavioral Health to provide certain staff for the Behavioral Health Advisory Council; repealing the 2004 Executive Order that established the Baltimore County Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council; merging the Baltimore County Mental Health Advisory Council

4 (B) THE TERMS OF ONE-THIRD OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE5 COUNCIL SHALL END EACH YEAR ON JUNE 30.

6 (C) A MEMBER WHO SERVES TWO CONSECUTIVE FULL THREE-YEAR
7 TERMS MAY NOT BE REAPPOINTED FOR TWO YEARS AFTER COMPLETION OF
8 THOSE TERMS.

9 (D) MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL RECEIVE NO SALARIES BUT SHALL 10 BE REIMBURSED FOR ALL EXPENSES NECESSARILY INCURRED IN THE 11 PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH APPROPRIATIONS 12 APPROVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND ADVICE AS IT CONSIDERS NECESSARY TO
 COMPLETE ITS DUTIES; AND

3 (4) ADOPT A SET OF RULES TO GOVERN ITS MEETING AND PROCEDURES.

- 21 establishing the Baltimore County Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council be repealed.
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SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that the Baltimore County Mental
 Health Advisory Council be merged into the Baltimore County Behavioral Health Advisory
 Council, pursuant to §10-309(c) of the Health-General Article of the Annotated Code of
 Maryland.

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6 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by
7 an affirmative vote of five (5) members of the County Council, shall take effect on November
8 18, 2018.
